From the Rector: Saying thank you and goodbye to Wyatt and Kelly

Over the next two months the ministries of two staff members will come to their planned conclusions. Even though both were anticipated to be of limited duration, these two individuals have brought significant blessings to our parish during that time.

Wyatt Poe has served as Organist/Choir Director since August 1, 2024. Although the shoes of his predecessor (Dr. Ken Miller) were large, Wyatt stepped into them and continued the dance without missing a beat. During Wyatt's time here, the adult choir has continued to grow musically, and the children's choir has shown impressive growth both numerically and musically. These two choirs are an enhancement of our worship and a blessing to our congregation.

Wyatt's all-round musicianship has been consistently at a high level, and he is always collaborative. I am extremely pleased we were able to commission him in 2025 to compose a musical setting of the *Pascha nostrum* (Christ our Passover) for Eastertide. It now resides in the back of our hymnals, and has been published by St. James Music

Press. Wyatt's last Sunday in the position of Organist/Choir Director is planned to be the Day of Pentecost: Sunday, May 24. He will remain in Sewanee an additional year to complete work toward the M.Div. as he discerns a call to the priesthood in the Diocese of Georgia.

The Rev. Kelly Ramer Moody has served as Curate since July 7, 2025. She generously approached me expressing interest in working in a part-time non-stipendiary capacity for the year after she completed her M.Div. Talk about grace! Kelly quickly became an important and trusted clergy colleague fully integrated into our ministries. She has a centered and kind pastoral presence, and preaches with great insight and wisdom.

I asked Kelly to be the parish staff person for growing our work in evangelism. She and Kathryn Bruce have led us in continuing existing efforts like the newcomers' gathering, while also adding elements such as ministry spotlights, foyer groups, and a new brochure for Sewanee's visitor center. Kelly also led the Vestry in exploring evangelism at its retreat earlier this year. Kelly's last Sunday with us will be June 7. She and her family will be returning to her diocese (Olympia), where Kelly will start work on July 20 as Curate of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Seattle.

Please join me in celebrating and thanking Wyatt and Kelly at special coffee hours on their last Sundays, as well as between now and then. It's impossible to thank them too much!

The Rev. Rob Lamborn will be away for pilgrimage to Biblical sites in Türkiye and Greece April 22-May 7. The church office remains open regular hours. For pastoral matters, please contact Archdeacon Betty Carpenter, or for other urgent matters outside of office hours, Senior Warden John Gatta (April 22-23 and April 27-May 7) or Junior Warden Chris Asmussen (April 24-26).

Vestry Update: At its regular meeting on April 16, the Vestry:

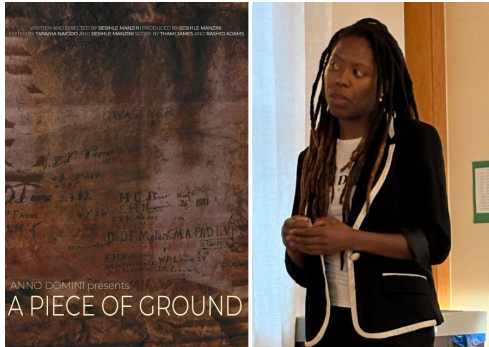

A Film Screening:

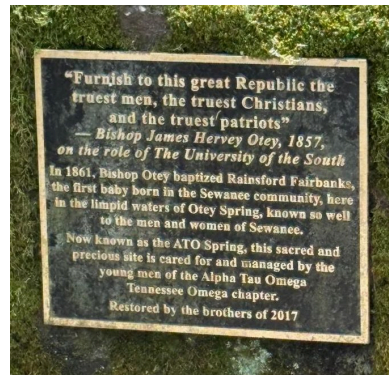
A Piece of Ground: Seeing Space, Memory, and Justice Through South African Eyes

In our first 6 months, the Guild has installed recycling bins in Kennerly Hall, as part of a newly-enlarged recycling program. We've partnered with our parish youth group to sort and bag bin contents, which Guild members then transport to the convenience center. The Guild was also able to share historical information about St. Hildegard, the work of the Guild and some future hopes during a Lenten supper presentation on March 11.

April 12 was designated Creation Care Sunday. The service included special prayers, hymns, the new Guild banner, and a take-home bulletin cover with information about the Guild and its work. Additional bulletin

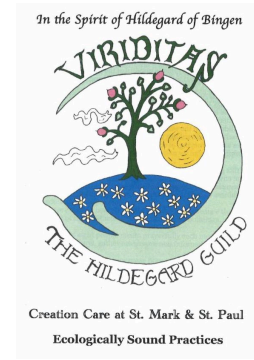
covers, plus recycling-reminder bookmarks, are available in KennerlyHall.

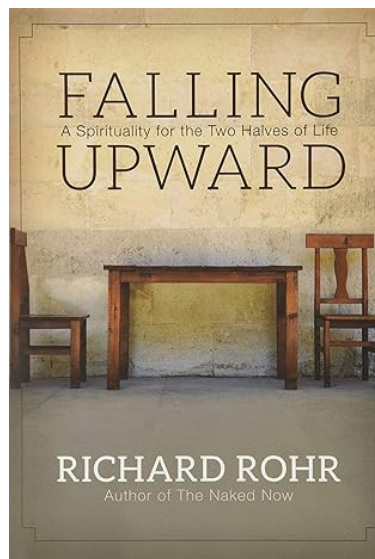

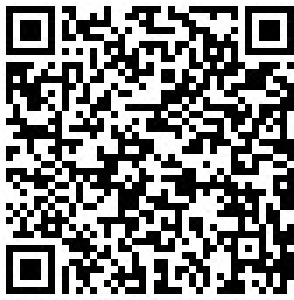

Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer through which we consent to God's presence and action within us. Those who practice it do so not in place of corporate worship and service, but rather as a necessary complement to those modes of engaging with God and with neighbor. With chairs encircling a candle at the front of the nave, we have a brief check-in about our prayer practice and anything else going on in our lives, and then we have a meditation session (what we call a "sit") together. Sunday School for All Ages

Additional adult volunteers are needed for our Sunday School classes. All volunteers participate in online training and a background check. Please see Jeannie Babb to find out more.

Godly Play 1 is for children aged 3 to 5. The basic Godly Play stories are introduced and considered. Learning is enhanced with art, music, and play. At times, this class will be combined with Godly Play 2.

Godly Play 2 offers children in grades 1-3 an opportunity to learn enrichment lessons and go deeper into the story. This classroom has the same structure as Godly Play 1 – story, wondering, work, feast, and sometimes a romp on the playground.

4th/5th Class takes children in grades 4 and 5 beyond Godly Play. This class meets in Brooks Hall to read and talk about books, applying Scripture to fictional situations and their own lives. The schedule also includes time for food, fellowship, and fun with art, Legos, etc. The first book for this year is Maniac Magee by Jerry Spinelli. Class leaders are Julia Bates and Matthew Mitchell.

Youth Sunday School offers middle schoolers and high schoolers a time to encounter God and get to know one another. Paul and Andrea Richaud lead this class with a fresh, relational style based on teachable moments. (See notes above for our current focus on Confirmation.)

Our EfM cohort includes students in Year 1 studying Hebrew Scripture, Year 2 studying Christian Scripture, Year 3 Christian History, Year 4 Christian Ethics and Spirituality, one in taking the new Wide Angle program which delves into a mix of texts. EfM opens with worship, then a discussion of texts. Each session includes a reflection on a story, event, or artwork. The goal of EfM is to deepen faith and to discover expressions of that faith in service to others.



CAC Information

The Community Action Committee (CAC) is open Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Neighbors are able to visit the office during this time to pick out groceries in the pantry and inquire about assistance with utility bills. The work of CAC is not possible without the support of the Parish of St. Mark & St. Paul.

March at the CAC Food Pantry

In March, CAC continued its mission of supporting neighbors in need throughout the community. During the month, the pantry served 116 unique households, representing 305 individuals. Most visits came from residents of Sewanee, Sherwood, Monteagle, Winchester, and Tracy City.

Overall (including repeat visits), the food pantry distributed food to 210 households, helping feed approximately 573 individuals. CAC welcomed 17 new families during the month of March.

CAC Distributes Easter Meals to Families

Thank you for all the generous donations of food items for our Easter Meal Baskets! With your help, CAC was able to provide 64 families with the items to create an Easter meal. Our families were so excited to receive this special offering!

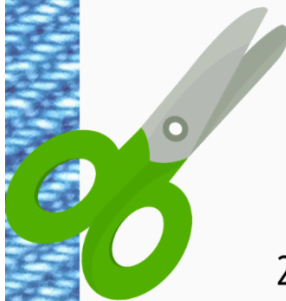

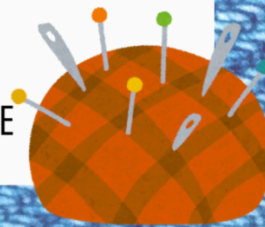

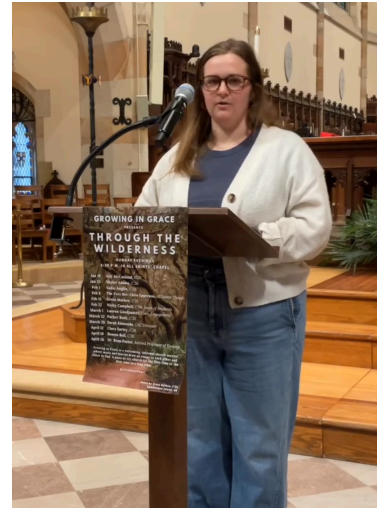

A Note from your Altar Guild

We wish to extend a warm welcome to our new parish members and a continued “thank you” to those who have been around a while.

The Altar Guild ministry is open to everyone – including men, as you

may have noticed in the weekly bulletin listing those serving each Sunday. Some families like to get involved and that is certainly encouraged. We like to utilize everyone’s particular skills. Some like to polish brass/silver while some like to wash linens for the Eucharist. I personally like the satisfaction of seeing the altar setup for the service – everything in its place and ready for the ministers to use during the service.

Like everything else, altar guild service is not for everyone. We welcome you to try it out for a month or two to see if it is as fulfilling for you as it is for those of us currently serving. We promise we will be there to walk you through everything and we utilize checklists, post photographs or diagrams of altar setups and provide manuals to help us all remember what to do.

What type of time commitment is involved? For our regular services we schedule 2 members a Sunday. They usually meet on Sat. morning to polish and get the vessels setup for Sunday. On Sunday morning, one person comes prior to the 8:30am service (around 8:00am) and sets out the prepared items. After that service both members clean what was used and resets for the 11:00am service. After that service the second member cleans and puts everything away. Of course there are special services such as funerals or seasonal services where we all pitch in according to our availability.
