

# From the Rector: Reflecting on 10 years

I am very grateful to the Parish Life Committee, to those who spoke or gave me cards, and to all who attended the August 31 special coffee hour celebrating 10 years of ministry together. It was a joy to share that occasion with you! I deeply appreciate the parish's generosity via the gifts of a restaurant gift certificate and a check.

When I think back over the last 10 years, some of my expectations have proven accurate. Parishioners are deeply committed to the life of Christian faith, including living that faith in the world. We are a medium-size parish that punches above its weight--is considerably more active than most parishes of similar size. Your stewardship, along with dedicated lay leaders and staff members all contribute to making it so. Our formation programs reflect how highly we value lifelong learning. CAC has continued to grow in service to an increasing number of people in need. Our identity as a strong-singing congregation has been enhanced by additional musical offerings. The University of the South and its people provide gifts of intellect and spirit that benefit the entire community.

The three main things I didn't expect ten years ago were being diagnosed with eye cancer, COVID, and renaming the parish. Any single one could shake a congregation deeply, and the three began or took place over a single 3-year period: 2019-2021. It is a testimony to people's spiritual maturity that we walked through them together while maintaining strong relationships.

It doesn't surprise me that I am still here, as I had hoped this would--and still hope it will--be a long rectorate! Love of God and love of neighbor each reinforce the other! I am treasuring the depth of connection that we have developed over such a length of time. Together may we continue to listen for, and respond to, God's call.

#### **Growth at Sewanee Children's Center**

You may have read the front-page article on SCC recently in the Sewanee Messenger, and/or noticed construction at the rear of the playground or near the gravel driveway behind Claiborne Parish Hall. As a result of the closure of the University Child Care Center, SCC has almost doubled its enrollment from a year ago. Remodeling indoors has provided SCC the facilities to offer infant care for the first time. A new small grassy play area is geared toward infants and toddlers. An outdoor classroom is being constructed at the back of the playground to support expanded programming. SCC needed to convert its storage room to infant care, so a storage shed is being built behind the gravel driveway in an unobtrusive area. All of these improvements are being funded by a grant from the University of the South.

SCC staff and volunteers have worked tirelessly on the monumental and multi-faceted project of combining two schools over the summer. New SCC Director (and former UCCC Director) Elizabeth Sowell is off to a strong start with an expanded faculty, including a number of teachers from UCCC. We are working together toward a lease that clarifies and strengthens our relationship, and on solutions to the need for additional parking.

It is very satisfying to witness SCC's expansion, and to continue providing space as we have since 1949--not as a moneymaker but as a community service. Our campus is now adorned with even more voices of children through the week. God must be enjoying it!

# **Vestry Update -- (regular meeting of August 28):**

## Vestry Service at St. Mark & St. Paul (Fall 2025)

Vestry members serve three-year terms starting January 1, and must be out of office at least a year before standing for election to another full term.

#### The formal qualifications for Vestry members are:

- --Confirmed member in good standing of the Parish of St. Mark & St. Paul. (Clergy are enrolled members of their diocese, not a parish, and thus aren't eligible.)
- --At least 16 years of age
- --Regular in worship attendance
- --Have made and are fulfilling a pledge in the current year
- --Not an employee of St. Mark & St. Paul or another organization or institution of the Diocese of Tennessee
- --Complete a background check by the Diocese of Tennessee

#### Informal qualifications are important, as well:

- --Committed to the Christian life and ministry of this parish
- --Approach the work prayerfully
- --Work well in a group, listening openly and respectfully to points of view that differ from their own
- --Speak their minds straightforwardly during deliberations while supporting decisions the Vestry reaches as a whole

# What do Vestry members do?

- --Complete "Safeguarding God's People" online training
- --Disclose any potential conflicts of interest
- --Prepare for and attend monthly regular meetings and any called meetings
- --Stay up-to-date on parish communications
- --Participate in an annual retreat
- --Help envision the ministry and needs of the parish in the present and future
- --Be on duty about once a month for the early service and between services, or for the late service and after church.
- --Serve as a Teller (counter of offering) about once every two months
- --Act as chair of, or liaison to, a particular committee or ministry area
- --Adopt the annual parish budget and monitor parish finances
- --Deliberate and decide important issues in the life of the parish

--Enjoy the privilege of serving the people of God at St. Mark & St. Paul

The **Nominating Committee** customarily consists of the Vestry members completing their terms and not eligible to run in 2026: Robin Bates, Dorothy Gates, and Mary Priestley. You may contact any member of the Nominating Committee to recommend yourself or someone else (with that person's permission).

# **Sunday School for All Ages**

Additional adult volunteers are needed for our Sunday School classes. All volunteers participate in online training and a background check. Please see Jeannie Babb to find out more.

**Godly Play 1** is for children aged 3 to 5. The basic Godly Play stories are introduced and considered. Learning is enhanced with art, music, and play. At times, this class will be combined with Godly Play 2.

**Godly Play 2** offers children in grades 1-3 an opportunity to learn enrichment lessons and go deeper into the story. This classroom has the same structure as Godly Play 1 – story, wondering, work, feast, and sometimes a romp on the playground.

**4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Class** takes children in grades 4 and 5 beyond Godly Play. This class meets in Brooks Hall to read and talk about books, applying Scripture to fictional situations and their own lives. The schedule also includes time for food, fellowship, and fun with art, Legos, etc. The first book for this year is Maniac Magee by Jerry Spinelli. Class leaders are Julia Bates and Matthew Mitchell.

**Youth Sunday School** offers middle schoolers and high schoolers a time to encounter God and get to know one another. Paul and Andrea Richaud led the class in 2024-2025 with a fresh, relational style based on teachable moments.

**Help Wanted:** We are seeking additional teachers to lead or assist the class on a rotational basis (you can specify once or twice a month) so all the teachers can continue their own formation as well.

# **Tuesday Lectionary Class**

Scott Lee, this class is open to everyone in the community. It's a place to consider the lesson more deeply and reflect on it together.

# **Centering Prayer**

Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer through which we consent to God's presence and action within us. Those who practice it do so not in place of corporate worship and service, but rather as a necessary complement to those modes of engaging with God and with neighbor. With chairs encircling a candle at the front of the nave, we have a brief check-in about our prayer practice and anything else going on in our lives, and then we have a meditation session (what we call a "sit") together. # **Education for Ministry**

EfM is a four year program of study which explores a wider concept of ministry by examining life through a theological lens. Participants from all four years, divided by their topic of study (Year 1- Hebrew Bible, Year 2 -New Testament, Year 3-History of Christianity, and Year 4- Contemporary Theology) reflect upon various concerns from their readings, the relationship of those themes between each of the four years, and the implications of the theme in today's world. Reflection on these themes is perceived through four different perspectives-experience, culture, tradition (Episcopal Church), and personal beliefs. The goal of EfM is to deepen faith and to discover expressions of that faith in service to others.

Registration for 2025-2026, including a newly revised curriculum celebrating 50 years of EfM, is taking place now. Classes begin after Labor Day. Please contact

The work of CAC is not possible without the support of the Parish of St. Mark & St. Paul.



# The Pantry Needs You!

People often ask, "What is better - a food donation or a monetary donation?" The truth is, both make a difference for CAC and the neighbors we serve. CAC is serving more than 100 families each month, so keeping enough food on the shelves has been a challenge. All monetary donations greatly support our mission by covering food purchases and helping with utility bill assistance for our neighbors. At the same time though, when we express the need for specific food items, we are in need of those items at the moment to stock the pantry. Several of the items that we ask for are not available through our regional food bank, therefore we rely on the support of the community to keep them available in the pantry. This is most true for our hygiene and personal care items. These items are a constant need for our neighbors as the cost of these are not covered by the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), or other benefits they may receive. It is only if they have a few extra dollars that they

could cover the cost of toilet paper or soap for their families. Any and all donations are always appreciated to support the Community Action Committee. Monetary donations can be made online at www.cacsewanee.org, or by checks made out to "Community Action Committee." Item donations can be dropped off anytime at CAC in the cabinet located on the porch outside the CAC doors, or the bin located inside the church doors at St. Mark & St. Paul. We are thankful for the support of our parish in helping us better serve our neighbors!

# A Note from your Altar Guild

We wish to extend a warm welcome to our new parish members and a continued "thank you" to those who have been around a while.

The Altar Guild ministry is open to everyone – including men, as you may have noticed in the weekly bulletin

listing those serving each Sunday. Some families like to get involved and that is certainly encouraged. We like to utilize everyone's particular skills. Some like to polish brass/silver while some like to wash linens for the Eucharist. I personally like the satisfaction of seeing the altar setup for the service — everything in its place and ready for the ministers to use during the service.

Like everything else, altar guild service is not for everyone. We welcome you to try it out for a month or two to see if it is as fulfilling for you as it is for those of us currently serving. We promise we will be there to walk you through everything and we utilize checklists, post photographs or diagrams of altar setups and provide manuals to help us all remember what to do.

What type of time commitment is involved? For our regular services we schedule 2 members a Sunday. They usually meet on Sat. morning to polish and get the vessels setup for Sunday. On Sunday morning, one person comes prior to the 8:30am service (around 8:00am) and sets out the prepared items. After that service both members clean what was used and resets for the 11:00am service. After that service the second member cleans and puts everything away. Of course there are special services such as funerals or seasonal services where we all pitch in according to our availability.


