Lord, open our lips.

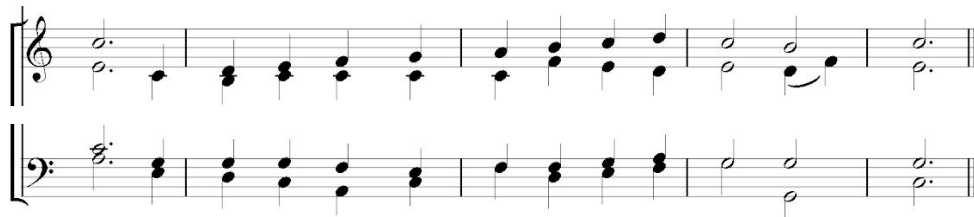
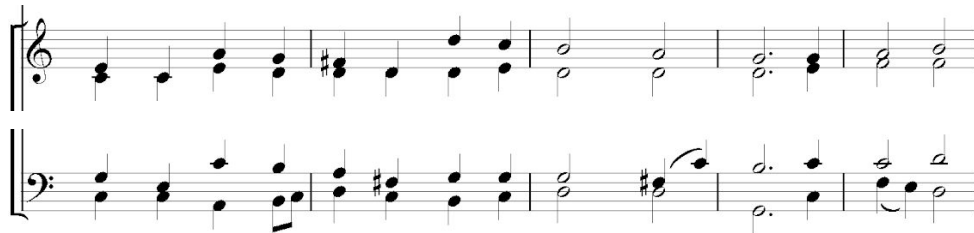
