

From the Rector-- When in our music God is glorified . . .

On Pentecost we heard our adult and children's choirs sing for the last time this school year. As they have on a few other occasions this year, they sang together. "There's a sweet, sweet Spirit in this place, " their voices proclaimed. Throughout the year our choirs have markedly enhanced our experience of the beauty of holiness in worship together.

A year ago neither of those two choirs was active. We have much to be thankful for in the ministries of Ken Miller with the adult choir and Meghan Mazur (fall semester) and Beth Sperry (spring semester) with the children's choir. After the 11:00 service on May 19we gave thanks for Ken's ministry at a festive reception.

Choirs need more than directors; they require singers! I appreciate the time and effort devoted to rehearsals and services by the members of both choirs, and by the parents of children's choir members in arranging for their kids to participate. The children's choir also relies on the assistance of volunteer helpers, this semester principally Janet Cooper. Ken Miller will play at the Sunday service June 23; otherwise through the end of July we will have substitute organists.







Incoming Organist/Choir Director Wyatt Poe will start work here in August, and I am pleased to expand on his background so you can start to get to know him.

Wyatt graduated from Columbus State University's Schwob School of Music with a Bachelor's degree in Organ Performance in 2021. That year he won first prize in contemporary music and second prize in romantic music at the Charleston International Festival of Music. Wyatt has studied choral conducting privately, and has led or assisted in leading music at three Episcopal churches. He also has experience in children's music education, and will conduct the children's choir in addition to the adult choir. Wyatt will begin the General Track of the Master of Arts program at the School of Theology this fall. He will be joined in Sewanee by his partner, Carter, and two cats, Mister and Kylo. In addition to sacred music, Wyatt enjoys cooking, staying active, and playing all kinds of games.



Rite 13

Rite 13's academic year concluded with a year-end party on Sunday, May 19. Please see your email for details.

Rite 13 is the first module of Journey to Adulthood (J2A). J2A is centered on inclusive, relational ministry and uses Bible study, prayer, rites of passage, and service projects. There are three modules included in the program: Rite 13, J2A, and 4Ward, each with lessons organized around Self, Society, and Spirituality."

The program is led by Hilary Bogert-Winkler, who is a priest, longtime youth leader, and assistant professor of liturgy at the seminary.

Rite 13 will start up again in the fall and is open to all youth in grades 6-8.

Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer through which we consent to God's presence and action within us. Those who practice it do so not in place of corporate worship and service, but rather as a necessary complement to those modes of engaging with God and with our neighbor. Having a core of people in the parish who practice contemplative prayer makes a difference.

The Centering Prayer support group at St. Mark and St. Paul's continues to meet faithfully every Monday night. With chairs encircling a candle at the front of the nave, we have a brief check-in about our prayer practice and anything else going on in our lives, and then we have a meditation session (what we call a "sit") together. Education for Ministry

The EfM seminar meets on Monday nights from 6:30 until 9:00 in the Hethcock Room. We are a vivacious group of nine (seven women and two men) covering all 4 years of the EfM program: Year 1 studies the Hebrew Bible, Year 2 studies the New Testament, Year 3 studies the History of Christianity, and Year 4 studies contemporary theology of the Episcopal tradition.

Participants from all four years reflect upon various concerns from their readings, the relationship of those themes between each of the four years, and the implications of the theme in today's world. We reflect on these themes through four different perspectives- experience, society (culture), tradition (Episcopal Church), and personal beliefs. The goal of EfM is to deepen faith and to discover expressions of that faith in service to others.

EfM will open for new students in Fall, 2024.



The Community Action Committee is an outreach program of St. Mark & St. Paul, which serves our neighbors in need. Our doors are open Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM for people to shop in our food pantry, and ask for utility payment assistance. We serve about 60 families a month, and are always in need of food and nonfood (cleaning supplies, paper products, hygiene items, etc.) items to keep our shelves stocked. Donations are always welcomed, especially on the first Sunday of every month for CAC Pantry Sunday.

CAC had a full month full of serving our neighbors, packing meals, and celebrating our seniors at the last Community Meal of the semester!

Kitchen 2 Table is a CAC program that takes unused portions of food from the Sewanee Dining Hall and repackages them into microwaveable meals. On average, each month CAC receives about 600 pounds of food and creates 500 meals.
